American Bald Eagle

Wildlife Center volunteers, Esther Plummer, Lindy Williams, and her daughter, Lindsay Williams, rescued four eagles at separate locations in April. They transported the birds to the Florida Audubon Center for Birds of Prey either the night of the rescues or the following day. In all four cases, the young eagles were in trouble and would not have survived without human intervention. Tragically, one did not survive. Our Center is the only one in this area which has volunteers who will go on rescues "after hours". We are fortunate to have such dedicated individuals willing to work such long hours-they are quite remarkable.
